WEEKLY SCRIPTURE

Read: Matthew 6:9-13

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Surrendering Your Position

When you begin prayer with "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name", how does this reshape your posture before God?

→ In what ways do you need to remember that you are His child, not His commander? (James 4:10)

Surrendering Your Plans

Jesus invites us to pray "Your kingdom come, Your will be done."

→ Where in your life are you still trying to make your own kingdom come instead of aligning with God's? (Proverbs 3:5–6)

Surrendering Your Provision

"Give us this day our daily bread" teaches us to trust God one day at a time.

→ What's one area of your life where you need to release anxiety about tomorrow and trust God for today? (Philippians 4:19)

Surrendering Your Past

Jesus connects forgiveness received with forgiveness given.

- → Who might you need to forgive so that your heart can experience freedom and healing?
- → What keeps you from letting go of old debts or grudges? (Ephesians 4:32)

Surrendering Your Protection

"Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

- → What temptations do you need to bring into the light so God can lead you away from them?
- → How can your group help you stay alert and accountable? (1 Corinthians 10:13)

Surrendering Your Praise

When you close prayer with "For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever,"

→ How does praise at the end of prayer reframe your worries or your desires? (Romans 11:36)

PRACTICE SURRENDERING

Pray one phrase from the Lord's Prayer each morning and live it out:

Monday: "Our Father in heaven" – Worship before you worry. Tuesday: "Your kingdom come" – Obey before you argue. Wednesday: "Give us this day" – Trust before you take. Thursday: "Forgive us" – Release before you resent.

Friday: "Lead us not" – Follow before you fall.

Saturday: "For Yours is the kingdom" – Praise before you post.

Surrender isn't giving up; it's giving over.
