SCRIPTURE

John 1:43-51

Take your time, and write down what stands out to you.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. In John 1 we see a chain of invitations: John the Baptist points to Jesus, two disciples follow Him, Andrew brings Peter, Jesus calls Philip, and Philip invites Nathanael. Why do you think the gospel often spreads through personal relationships rather than large public events?
2. Jesus' invitation to Philip was simple: "Follow me." What do you think it practically means to follow Jesus in everyday life today?
3. Many people assume they need to fix their lives before coming to Jesus. In the Gospels, Jesus invites people first and transformation follows. Why do you think it is difficult for people to believe that Jesus invites them as they are?
4. Philip did not argue with Nathanael's skepticism. He simply said, "Come and see." What can we learn from Philip's approach when talking with people who have doubts about Jesus?
5. Jesus tells Nathanael, "I saw you under the fig tree." Nathanael realizes Jesus fully knows him. How does the idea that Jesus knows everything about us make you feel? Encouraged, uncomfortable, or something else?
6. The invitation of Jesus involves being fully known and still welcomed. What are some ways people try to hide parts of their lives from others or from God?
7. At the end of the passage, Jesus tells Nathanael, "You will see greater things than these." Where have you seen Jesus at work in your life recently, and what might it look like to keep saying "yes" to following Him?
